# The LOWELL HILTON Welcomes You

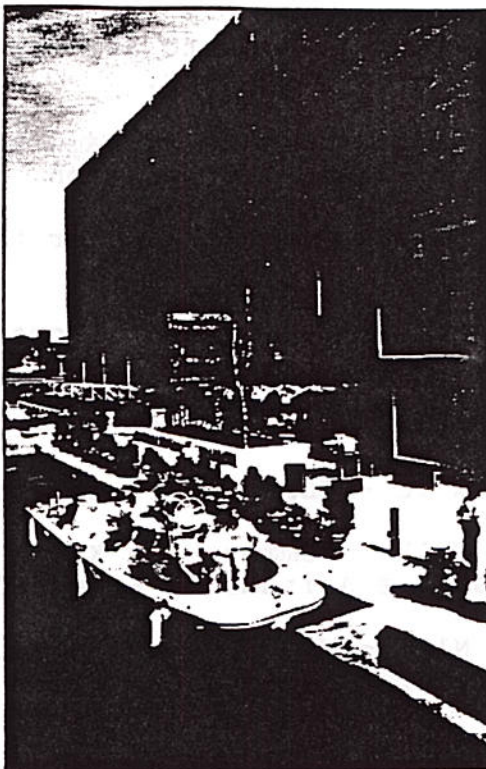
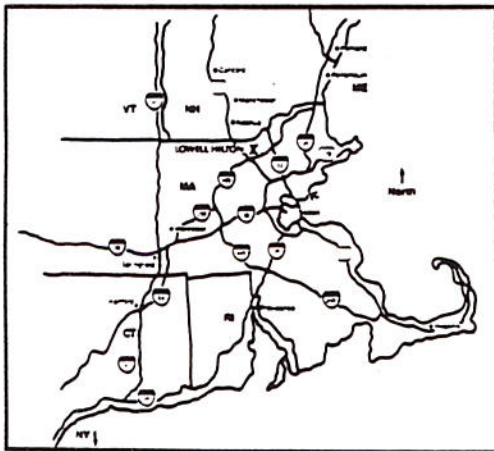
